## **BOND PACKAGE TIMELINE**

- Committee members appointed: **September 20, 2022**
- First meeting: **October 3, 2022**
- Last Meeting: January 9, 2023
- Joint work session with City Council: January 17, 2023
- City Council approval: February 7, 2023
- Election day: May 6, 2023



## **BOND ASSUMPTIONS**

- Six-year issuance horizon (2023 2028)
- Interest rates: 4% in FY23. 5% 5.5% in FY24 FY28
- Even annual issuances (~\$94.68 million per year)
- Population growth: 12,000 per year
- Annual taxable value growth: 7% (4% new value, 3% revalue)
- Total tax rate not to exceed voter approval tax rate



### WHY ISSUE DEBT?

• The sale of bonds spreads the cost of building capital assets to those that benefit, both now and in the future.

• The sale of bonds evens out the expense of large projects over a period of time (usually 20 years for Frisco).

- Addition of new fire station 11 at Lebanon & Hunters Creek
- New fire vehicles:

2 squads, 4 engines, 8 medics, 1 truck and 1 hazmat

• New FD fleet services building

15K - 18K sqft with 100 ft double bays

• Replacement of self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA)

## **Joint Parks Ops/Building Services**

#### **Combined Cost: \$31 million**

#### PARKS OPERATION

- 21,000 sqft for office and cubicles
- 10,000 sqft climate-controlled workspace for mechanics & storage

#### **BUILDING SERVICES**

• 12,000 sqft for offices, cubicles, storage, workshop, test benches and warehouse storage

- 15,000 18,000 sqft facility
- Climate controlled warehouse




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

#### **Collin County**




